Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies (WGSS) is an interdisciplinary area of scholarship and research that focuses on the significance of gender as a variable in experience, history, and culture. WGSS raises questions that often have been ignored or marginalized, and it male the experience and history of women central to the study of any human concern. Scholarship in WGSS demonstrates the need to recognize new models of knowledge, and the need to be critical of theories and approaches that do not take into account the difference of gender and/or sexuality.

The WGSS major and minor may be combined with degrees from other departments, and the listed courses may count toward degrees in both departments. (Check with your other department first to confirm whether a WGSS course will count.)
